
WASHINGTON, Mar. 8, 2023—American Fuel & Petrochemical Manufacturers (AFPM) **President and CEO Chet Thompson** issued the following statement on the introduction of the [Preserving Choice in Vehicle Purchases Act](#). The legislation—introduced in the United States House of Representatives by Congressmen Bob Latta (R-OH5), John Joyce (R-PA13), Gus Bilirakis (R-FL12) and Jay Obernolte (R-CA23)—would limit the federal Environmental Protection Agency from issuing Clean Air Act waivers for state policies seeking to ban or otherwise limit the sale of internal combustion engine vehicles.

“Every American should be able to choose the type of car or truck they want to drive. Restricting consumer choice by eliminating competition and banning entire vehicle power trains is the wrong path to achieving cleaner transportation or supporting U.S. energy security; in fact, it could undercut both. Liquid fuels are an irreplaceable part of meeting future energy demand and will play an important role in reducing the carbon intensity of transportation.
