WASHINGTON, D.C. — American Fuel & Petrochemical Manufacturers **(AFPM)** President and CEO Chet Thompson and American Petroleum Institute **(API)** President and CEO Mike Sommers issued the following statement on today's passage in the House of Representatives of a <u>Congressional Review</u> <u>Act (CRA) resolution</u> aimed at overturning the U.S. EPA waiver authorizing California's Advanced Clean Cars II ban on sales of new gas, diesel and traditional hybrid vehicles:

"Today's vote was a huge win for U.S. consumers. We are one step closer to restoring consumers' ability to choose the cars that best meet their needs. California's unlawful ban should never have been authorized, and Governor Newsom should never have been allowed to seize this much control over the American vehicle market. We thank Speaker Johnson, Dr. Joyce and the Republican and Democratic members of the House who voted today to overturn California's ban on sales of new gas cars.

"We urge the Senate to act swiftly to approve their CRA resolution and get the final measure to President Trump for his signature, allowing him to deliver on his day 1 promise to end EV mandates in the United States. Consumers of all political stripes oppose gas car bans, EV mandates and allowing California to dictate transportation policy for the rest of the country."

California's Advanced Clean Cars II ban will be adopted in the following states and jurisdictions:

- 9. Oregon
- 10. Rhode Island
- 11. Vermont

None of these states and jurisdictions are close to meeting ACCII's 2026 target of <u>35% combined</u> <u>electric vehicle (EV), fuel cell and PHEV sales</u> (see current sales percentages on <u>page 9</u>). ACCII requires <u>each individual automaker</u> to meet the annual standards. In 2023, "ZEV" sales among incumbent automakers (those who are not pure-play EV manufacturers) were just <u>13%</u> in <u>California</u> (<u>page 4</u>). They were lower in every other state.

According to the Alliance for Automotive Innovation, EV registrations account for 2% of all light-duty vehicle registrations in the United States as of December 31, 2024 (page 16). There are nearly 289 million light-duty vehicles registered in the United States.
