Patel's career reflects decades of transformational leadership, from guiding LyondellBasell through record growth to setting the company's goal of producing 2 million metric tons of recycled and renewable based polymers by 2030. He also restructured W. R. Grace for long-term success and led a \$12.5 billion portfolio at Standard Industries. As a founding member and former vice chair of the Alliance to End Plastic Waste, Patel has been a leading voice for collaborative, global solutions to reduce and reuse plastic waste.

Patel holds a chemical engineering degree from The Ohio State University and an MBA from Temple University. He serves on the boards of Air Products and the Federal Reserve Bank of Dallas' Houston Branch.
